AB62 Workshop

The Nevada Division of Water Resources will be conducting workshops for to adopt regulations relating to the time for completion of work and the application of water to beneficial use. AB62 requires the State Engineer to conduct a survey relating to extensions of time to perfect a water right: and providing other matters properly relating thereto. Staff has been working with Warren Hardy and will be attending the workshops to offer insight and comments on the Districts behalf.

Water Dedication Ordinance

The District's Water Dedication Ordinance requires developers to dedicate potable water resources for their developments. In support of that document the creation of the *Payment in lieu of Water Rights Dedication Implementation Policy* was created to offer an avenue for developers to pay a fee for excess water resource in the District's portfolio. Until the State Engineer issues the Final order concerning water resources available to the District, management has placed a temporary moratorium on major parcel maps. All major parcel map submissions will be held for the Board of Directors review and approval.

Business Impact Statement

The Notice of Potential Increase was mailed out October 16th with a return dead line of November 12th. After the responses are compiled they will be incorporated into a Business Impact Statement for the Board to review and discuss at the December 6th Board of Directors Meeting. The earliest the proposed rate modification can be considered for adoption is at the January 9th Board of Directors meeting.

Water Resource Acquisition

Staff has started receiving more phone calls from individuals looking to sell their water resources. With the uncertainty of the outcome of the District's existing water rights portfolio, staff felt it prudent to pass this information along to the Board of Directors.
